



# Literacy Grid

<b>Venn Diagram</b> Compare and contrast You and the main character of a text, using a Venn diagram	<b>All about the character</b> Create a character analysis on one of the characters in your book Draw the character and write down their traits	<b>Dear Author</b> Write a letter to the author of your book. Explain why you like the book and ask them some questions about creating the book.	<b>Map Maker</b> Draw a map of the places they went in your book. Make sure to label the important parts and add pictures to show details of the story.	<b>Film Strip</b> Create a timeline using a flow map. You can draw the entire story or your favourite part of the story. 	<b>Dear classmate</b> Write a letter to a classmate telling them about a book you have read. Tell them your favourite part of the book, the main idea and a bit about the character. Give the book a rating.
<b>Change it!</b> Change the ending of a book you have read.	<b>Did you know?</b> Create a pamphlet describing a book. Talk about the most important parts, facts from the book and illustrate it.	<b>Book Mark it</b> Create a bookmark to match the book you are reading. Illustrate it with the characters and title.	<b>In 3's</b> Create a 3 fold pamphlet describing the beginning, middle and end of a story.	<b>Main idea</b> Write down 3 key details that help you identify the main idea of your text.	<b>Fun Facts</b> Read a non-fiction text and create a page using the facts you learned from the book.
<b>Predict it!</b> Draw an image to predict what will happen next in the text. Label or write what is happening. Then read to see if your prediction was correct.	<b>Word Steps</b> Find a word in your book that you think could be revised. Use steps to make the word better each time 	<b>Advertisement</b> Create an ad to sell your favourite book. Include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• picture of the cover</li> <li>• a title</li> <li>• the authors name</li> <li>• facts</li> <li>• what make it excellent</li> <li>• A price.</li> </ul>	<b>Cover it!</b> Create a new cover for your text. Make it different to the original cover but make sure you include the title, authors and illustrators name and some detailed images.	<b>Free Choice Writing</b> Pick your favourite genre and create a writing piece. Some ideas: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Poem</li> <li>• Informative</li> <li>• Story</li> <li>• Song</li> <li>• Persuasive</li> <li>• New paper article</li> </ul>	<b>Cross Word Fun!</b> Create a cross word or word search using key words from the text.

## POETRY

<p><b>Blackout poem</b></p> <p>Find a piece of writing (newspaper article) and blackout the words you DON'T want to create a poem.</p>	<p><b>Vocabulary</b></p> <p>Pick a topic, create a brainstorm of words you could use in a poem about that topic. Include nouns, verbs, adverbs and adjectives</p>	<p><b>Ode poem</b></p> <p>Create an ode poem to something in your house. Pick something that you use often and couldn't live without.</p>	<p><b>Haiku</b></p> <p>Write a double stanza haiku. Remember the structure of a haiku is...</p> <p>3 lines</p> <p>1<sup>st</sup> line-5 syllables</p> <p>2<sup>nd</sup> line-7 syllables</p> <p>3<sup>rd</sup> line-5 syllables</p>
<p><b>Create a diamante poem</b></p> <p>Remember the structure is...</p> <p>(7 lines long)</p> <p>1<sup>st</sup> line – 1x noun</p> <p>2<sup>nd</sup> line- 2x adjectives</p> <p>3<sup>rd</sup> line- 3x verbs</p> <p>4<sup>th</sup>- 4x nouns</p> <p>5<sup>th</sup>- 3x verbs</p> <p>6<sup>th</sup>- 2x adjectives</p> <p>7<sup>th</sup>- 1x noun</p>	<p><b>Magical Forest</b></p> <p>Create a poem about this image.</p> 	<p><b>Book Character</b></p> <p>Write a poem about character from your book.</p> <p>Don't forget to include physical traits and personality traits</p> 	<p><b>Reverse Poem</b></p> <p>A reverse poem mean one thing when read from top to bottom, but the meaning changes when you read each line from bottom to top.</p> <p>(Search 'Reverse poem' to see some examples)</p>
<p><b>Limerick</b></p> <p>A limerick poem is a short funny poem with the rhyming pattern</p> <p>A, A, B, B, A</p>	<p><b>Lyrics</b></p> <p>Find song with lyrics that have a strong message or write your own verse of a song.</p>	<p><b>Acrostic Poem</b></p> <p>Create an acrostic poem with sentences for each letter (not one word!)</p>	<p><b>Metaphors and Similes</b></p> <p>Create a brainstorm page of metaphors and similes</p>
