# A VIEW TO THE FUTURE

## Bren's Banter

Welcome back everyone to term four! I hope you all had a fantastic holiday with family, and a break from remote learning.

We are all very excited at the prospect of having all students back on site from 5<sup>th</sup> November. It will also be fantastic having our Prep and Grade 1/2 students attending part time from Monday 18<sup>th</sup> October, and then Grades 3/4 and 5/6 students attending part time from Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> October.

Whilst this term will no doubt present its challenges, Gembrook Primary School is extremely well placed to provide our students with a successful staggered return to on-site learning, as well as an engaging and rewarding final term for 2021. Our GIFT (Gembrook Improvement Focus Team) leadership team met over the holidays and finalised the details of the staggered return. As you will appreciate, the commencement of term, involving the continuation of remote learning, then transitioning to a staggered return, before finally having all students back on-site, will require an array of supports and adjustments. Please keep an eye out on Compass for regular updates about adjustments and supports in place as we transition through each phase of term four.

For now however, I will outline the plan for the *first two weeks of term:*

Remote learning continues – all students must continue to learn from home except for those with parents who are deemed essential workers or where students are deemed vulnerable.

Teachers will offer 3 teaching Webex sessions per week (1 x Reading, 1 x Writing and 1 x Maths) as well as the continuation of daily open Webex Q&A sessions.

Please note that the reduction in weekly teaching Webex sessions (reduced from 5 sessions per week) has been done to support teachers with planning for the staggered return, and to facilitate time for student assessment in preparation for report writing. As the staggered return commences in week three, further adjustments to the remote learning program will be communicated via Compass.

Teachers across all year levels will be planning for a successful transition back that will include lots of opportunities for students to debrief, reflect and share their experiences this year, reconnect with peers, re-establish class routines and expectations and refocus on learning in a classroom setting.

We'll work hard together to provide our students with the very best possible final term of learning for 2021. Of course. ALL staff, including our wonderful School Wellbeing Officer Vikki are here to support, encourage and facilitate a successful transition back to school.

Thank you so much for your flexibility, understanding and support as we navigate this term together.

*School improvement work over the holidays:*

As a school, we are always striving to improve, and again, lots of work was completed over the holidays.

A big thank you to Mr. Watson, our much-loved gregarious gardener and 'jack of all trades', who worked tirelessly during the holidays, weeding, pruning, whipper snipping and blower vaccing in order to prepare our school grounds magnificently for the coming term.

Our buildings and grounds are looking absolutely superb and certainly reflect the great pride that we all have in our school.

*Enrolments for 2021*

Already we are well underway with planning for 2022! Enrolment for 2022 at ANY level can be made NOW and I encourage you to share this with friends and families. Early confirmation of prep enrolments for next year will assist us greatly with planning in terms of staffing and grade structures.

*Planning for 2022*

Parents are very welcome to write to me outlining any relevant educational considerations for next year. I ask that written requests are based on *educational grounds* and reach me by Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> October. Any request I receive will be carefully considered by myself and all relevant staff, however I need to emphasise that teachers at Gembrook, as skilled professional educators, spend a considerable amount of time and effort in placing students into classes for the following year and therefore, staff recommendations will be a priority in relation to student class allocation.

**Please do not request a specific teacher.** We are proud to have built a team of highly dedicated and knowledgeable educators, who work together superbly, with a student-centred focus, whole school approach to teaching and learning and a priority placed on high quality instruction in literacy and numeracy. Also, as you would appreciate, teachers do not necessarily teach in the same level as the previous year.

Staff follow a carefully planned procedure for allocating students to their grade for the following year:

Students nominate five peers that they would like to be placed with. Students are advised that we will do everything possible to ensure that they will be placed with AT LEAST one of their nominated peers.

Classroom teachers meet and use the criteria of academic, social and emotional to compile draft grade lists. At this stage parent requests received in writing are also considered.

Draft lists are taken to our Gembrook Improvement Focus Team (GIFT) for discussion/input and final lists are then completed.

Students participate in 'Step Up Day' on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> December, spending time in their classroom for 2022 with their new grade and teacher.

I will provide further information about grade structures, staffing and programs for 2022 throughout this term. We are all looking forward to a great year of onsite learning next year!

# A VIEW TO THE FUTURE

## Bren's Banter

### Term 4 = Hats on!

Just a reminder that we ALL need to have our hats on at all times when we are outside. All students need a dark blue wide brimmed hat (caps are not acceptable as they do not provide sufficient sun protection).

### Emergency Management at Gembrook PS

As we approach the warmer weather, we all need to ensure that we are well prepared in the event of a bushfire emergency.



**The following is an update from The Department of Education and Training regarding procedures for our school during the bushfire season and it also contains particular information in relation to our school.**

Fire danger ratings and warnings are used in Victoria to provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life. Schools and children's services such as **Gembrook Primary School** are listed on the DET Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) and will be closed when a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined in their Bureau of Meteorology district. Where possible, we will provide parents with up to four days' notice of a potential Code Red day closure via letter, email, Compass, school electronic sign and the school website. A Code Red day will be determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner no later than 1.00 pm the day before the potential closure. Once we are advised of the confirmation of the Code Red day we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day.

**Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast.** This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that:

- No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Code Red day.
- Out-of-school-hours care will also be cancelled on these days
- School camps will be cancelled if a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined for the Bureau of Meteorology district in which the camp is located.

On these Code Red days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – **on such days children should never be left at home or in the care of older children.**

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the CFA advise that when Code Red days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Code Red day.

As part of preparing our school for potential hazards such as fire, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan.

### ***What can parents do?***

- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is closed.
- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers. Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters.
- Most importantly at this time of year, if you're planning a holiday or short stay in the bush or in a coastal area, you should check warnings in advance of travel and remain vigilant during your stay.
- If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.

# SCHOOL COUNCIL

## GPS SCHOOL COUNCIL SNAPSHOT: 18<sup>th</sup> August & 15<sup>th</sup> September 2021

Due to COVID restrictions, our School Council meetings were unable to occur onsite. The meetings were held via Webex.

### Student Voice and Agency

Stellar, our SRC school council representative, presented her report to school council via Webex, on 15<sup>th</sup> September meeting;

*Hello everyone, I'm Stellar and tonight I'll be talking about what we discussed in our SRC meeting on Tuesday the 24<sup>th</sup> of August.*

*As you will all know, we are launching the Positive Behaviours for Learning here at Gembrook Primary. For positive learning to take place we must understand what sorts of behaviours will help us learn. SRC discussed what sorts of reward systems might be useful. This included the idea of a token system of "Gemstones". When you're out in the yard if you do good things and have good behaviour you get one token. Students would take their token up to the office for safe keeping. When a student gets 10 tokens this is then called a gemstone. A gemstone can then be converted into the reward that they would like.*

*We then spoke about a whole class Gemstone Rewards. If the class gemstone container reaches the top, the whole class would be rewarded. Finally, we talked about different whole school rewards we could aim for with the Gemstones token system. I came up with the fun amazing idea of bring your dog to school day, but Mrs Liston wasn't too keen on that particular idea! Some other ideas were pyjama day or tape a teacher to a wall like we once did to Mr Fitz! There were other great ideas like having boardgames in the library on cold rainy days, a free dress day or even a whole school excursion to Puffing Billy.*

*We also talked about designing a new Gembrook logo, we didn't really come to a conclusion, although everyone came up with good ideas including animals, tree ferns or Puffing Billy.*

*We still haven't decided on what we're going to do with the 1 thousand four hundred dollars that was gifted to our school from the So Long Summer Fundraiser. Some of the more popular ideas were more senior books in the library and even some new musical instruments. Miss Schofield reminded us that we are in a very privileged position and we get a say in what our school decisions are. I would have to agree with her. Thank you for listening.*

### Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

Brendan presented an update around our PBL initiative. Students and families will be receiving a letter in the post to explain the start of the PBL initiative. The teachers and leadership have been working through the matrix and have completed the focus areas. The first area of focus will be "At All Times" and these are the expectations that all students, teachers and staff will be working towards. Each focus will be taught explicitly, with some lessons already beginning in the remote learning planners. The finalisation of the rewards process will occur when the SRC are able to meet and decide in readiness for students coming back onsite.

We have a COVID safe plan, in the event we are unable run the program as planned. Look out for information coming out soon!

### Buildings and Grounds

Asbestos: All families have been updated via Compass. The recommendations from the VSBA (Victorian Schools Building Authority) is that the area is deemed safe, the temporary fence will be removed, and the area will be covered with mulch.

Storm water: The VSBA is covering the costs for the repair of the storm water drain at the back of the basketball court.

Shade sail grant: An application has been made through the 2021 School Shade Grants Program, for a shade sail over the sand pit.

### Fundraising

Although we are trying to provide fundraising and community engaging activities, it is all dependent on the Victorian Government and the Victorian Chief Health Officer, and DET regulations around school operations and COVID regulations;

A Chicken Nugget Day fundraiser has been approved in term 4, when we are all back onsite.

The school council is looking into the Colour Run fundraiser. WATCH THIS SPACE!

Art Calendar fundraiser has been approved at \$15 per calendar, look out for Mrs. D's notification in term 4.

### GPS Parent Survey 2021

Brendan presented a summary of the GPS Parent Survey 2021 on 15<sup>th</sup> September. There were 38 eligible responses to the survey and all families who responded were thanked for their time and feedback. The survey contained 6 questions;

Why is your child at GPS?

What does GPS do well?

What have been the highlights?

What is your vision over the next 5 years?

What improvements can you make?

What way would you like to be involved?

The actions created from school council were;

The Gembrook Improvement Focus Team (GIFT) will table an item to discuss strategies and actions for improvement.

The implementation of PBL was recognised as a way to make positive changes at GPS

A Community Engagement Working Group was formed to investigate ways to increase parent engagement with our school.

As per all annual DET surveys, Brendan will share a summary of the GPS Parent Survey 2021 in a future newsletter.

### Finance

The school continues to be in a sound financial position with funds available for everyday operations and committed funds for specific school programs and projects. Council reviewed the July and August accounts including bank balances, statements, purchasing cards, EFTPOS and bank transfers from the set-off account to the official account. A review of the cash budget was performed by the Finance Subcommittee.

From Monday 4 October, Prep to Year 2 students and final year students will continue to attend onsite. Further announcements will be made prior to the start of Term 4.
