Current research states that one of the things that high performing schools have in common is that they set and maintain high expectations for the entire school. As stated above, our Start Up program included unpacking and discussing 'Respect' and 'High Expectations' with all students. It would be great if you could please regularly discuss 'Respect' and 'High Expectations' with your child (particularly over the next few weeks) as they begin their new school year.

Priorities for 2024 at GPS

Once our 2024 Annual Implementation Plan (AIP) has been formally approved, we will upload it to the school website. I can however, share with you our focus areas for this year.

In line with the Department of Education and Training (DET) Framework for Improving Student Outcomes (FISO 2.0), our 2024 AIP will focus on 2 core elements:

Learning

Expectations.

Wellbeing

Broadly speaking, the first core element will involve targeted and high-level professional learning for staff, with a particular emphasis on literacy and numeracy. The second core element will involve increasing student voice and agency (with a particular emphasis on student engagement in learning), individual student goal setting and monitoring, celebrating achievement and building school pride and sense of belonging. Underpinning these priorities and initiatives will be Gembrook Primary School's values of Respect and High

Our GPS 2024 AIP actions include:

- Extension of GPS Student Learning Digital Portfolios to enhance family engagement in student learning (more information to follow!).
- Continuation of Tutor Learning Initiative (TLI) in literacy (reading) and numeracy (number).
- Embedding the Gembrook Primary School Developmental Curriculum Continuum where students can track their own progress in literacy and numeracy and set new individual learning goals.
- Engagement with highly regarded education consultant Danny Hyndman.
- Embedding the GPS Positive Behaviours for Learning (PBL) initiative.
- Increase opportunities for student voice and agency throughout the school.
- Investigate tools for recording and monitoring student wellbeing.
- Increase opportunities for student engagement in learning.
- Continuation of GPS Student Electives
- Investigate opportunities to enhance community links.

<u>High Expectations – School uniform!</u>

Thank you to mums and dads and most of our students who came to school on Tuesday in absolutely FULL school uniform.....including.....black shoes and a navy broad brimmed hat!

I need to remind families that black bike shorts are not part of our school uniform. A number of girls are wearing these now and they do not comply with our uniform policy. Please speak to your child about this.



Update Contact Information

Please inform the school if your contact information changes. Changes can be made on the COMPASS app or by contacting the school office. We must be able to contact you in case your child is sick or has been injured. If the primary carers / parents don't respond, the emergency contacts provided on your child's enrolment form will be contacted.

Anaphylaxis / Food Allergy

There are a growing number of children who suffer from a variety of allergies. Most serious are those allergic to foods such as nuts, nut products, and dairy products, and their severe reaction is known as anaphylaxis. At Gembrook Primary School, we have a child who is in this category.

The teaching staff have a number of procedures in place to ensure that appropriate precautions are taken. Parents are requested to be very conscious of the danger that food allergies pose for some children.

We ask you to support the health of children with food allergies by ensuring that your child understands that they should not touch food that belongs to someone else and should not share food. It would also be appreciated if families could avoid sending products containing nuts (including peanut butter, cookies, muesli bars with nuts etc) to school in your child's lunch. Peanut butter for breakfast and dinner but not for lunch! It is vitally important to please wash hands thoroughly if handling these foods before coming into the school.

If you are sending food for sharing, perhaps for a birthday, we ask that the classroom teacher is informed prior to the time, so that the parents of these children are given the opportunity to provide a special treat for them on the day. Thank you for your understanding.

Annual privacy reminder

Our school collects, uses, discloses and stores student and parent personal information for standard school functions or where permitted by law, as stated in the Schools' Privacy Policy available on the school website.

We invite you to book in for our Getting to know you interviews.

Teachers will be available 3:30-4:30 pm on Monday February 12th, Wednesday February 14th and Tuesday February 20th, 2024.

The main purpose of these interviews is for parents to share any information you believe is important for teachers to know to foster your child's learning and success at school.

SCHOOL NEWS

A Department of Education Mobile Phone and Digital Devices Policy came into effect from Term 1, 2020



SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS

School council elections - information for parents

What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the broad direction of a school, in accordance with Ministerial Order 1280 Constitution of Government School Councils, and the Education and Training Reform Act 2006. In doing this, a school council may directly influence the quality of education for students.

Who is on the school council?

For most primary school councils, there are several possible categories of membership:

- A mandated elected parent member category more than one-third of the total members must be from this category. Department employees can be parent members at their child's school providing that they are not engaged in work at the school.
- A mandated elected school employee member category members of this category make up no more than one-third of membership. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members
- **An optional community member category –** members are co-opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experience. Department employees are not eligible to be community members.

A small number of school councils have **nominee members**.

For all schools with a Year 7 and above cohort, there is an additional category of membership:

A mandated elected student member category, two positions.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

Why is parent membership so important?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills and a range of experiences and knowledge that can help inform and shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

Do I need special experience to be on school council?

Each member brings their own valuable skills and knowledge to the role, however, in order to successfully perform their duties, councillors may need to gain some new skills and knowledge. It is important to have an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

Code of conduct for school councillors

School councils in Victoria are public entities as defined by the *Public Administration Act 2004*. School councillors must comply with the Code of Conduct for Directors of Victorian Public Entities issued by the Victorian Public Sector Commission. The Code of Conduct is based on the Victorian public sector values and requires councillors to:

- **act with honesty and integrity** be truthful, open and clear about their motives and declare any real, potential or perceived conflict of interest and duty
- act in good faith in the best interests of the school work cooperatively with other councillors and the school community, be reasonable, and make all decisions with the best interests of students foremost in their minds
- **act fairly and impartially** consider all relevant facts of an issue before making a decision, seek to have a balanced view, never give special treatment to a person or group and never act from self-interest
- **use information appropriately** respect confidentiality and use information for the purpose for which it was made available
- **exercise due care, diligence and skill** accept responsibility for decisions and do what is best for the school
- use the position appropriately not use the position as a councillor to gain an advantage

act in a financially responsible manner – observe all the above principles when making financial decisions

comply with relevant legislation and policies – know what legislation and policies are relevant for which decisions and obey the law

demonstrate leadership and stewardship – set a good example, encourage a culture of accountability, manage risks effectively, exercise care and responsibility to keep the school strong and sustainable.

Indemnity for school council members

School councillors are indemnified against any liability in respect of any loss or damage suffered by the council or any other person in respect of anything necessarily or reasonably done, or omitted to be done by the councillor in good faith in:

the exercise of a power or the performance of a function of a councillor, or

the reasonable belief that the act or omission was in the exercise of a power or the performance of a function of a council.

In other words, school councillors are not legally liable for any loss or damage suffered by council or others as a result of reasonable actions taken in good faith.

How can you become involved?

By participating in, and voting in the school council elections, which are held in Term 1 each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant

In view of this, you might consider:

standing for election as a member of the school council

encouraging another person to stand for election.

What do you need to do to stand for election?

The principal will issue a Notice of Election and Call for nominations in Term 1 of each year. Council elections must be completed by 31 March, unless varied by the Minister for Education.

If you stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or, you can nominate yourself in the parent member category. You can only be nominated by another member of the same electorate that you are eligible for (e.g. a member of the parent electorate may only nominate another parent of that electorate)

Department employees with a child enrolled at a school where they are not engaged in work, are eligible to nominate for parent membership at that school.

Return your completed nomination form to the principal within the time stated on the Notice of Election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt via post, email or by hand delivery.

Generally, if there are more nominations than vacancies a ballot will be conducted in the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

Remember

Consider standing for election to school council.

Ask the principal for instructions if you are not sure what to do.

Be sure to vote if the election goes to ballot.

Contact the principal if you are unsure about what is required at any stage of the election process.

NOMINATIONS TAKE PLACE FROM THE 5th TO THE 12th of February 2024

Nomination forms will be available at the school office and on Compass. There are 5 parent vacancies available in 2024.

Schools on the Bushfire At-Risk Register and Category 4



School preparedness and pre-emptive actions for the bushfire season

Fire danger ratings indicate how dangerous a fire would be if one started in those conditions and provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life. They can be a trigger for action in the community and for school and household level fire plans.

Schools and children's services listed on the Department of Education and Training's Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR), and those at some lower risk of bushfire or grassfire on the Category 4 list, will be closed when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their Bureau of Meteorology district.

Gembrook Primary School has been identified as a BARR school and our school will close when there is a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating in the CENTRAL fire district.

Schools and early childhood services listed on the Department of Education and Training's Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) and those at lower risk of bushfire or grassfire on the Category 4 list take pre-emptive actions on elevated fire danger days to minimise the risk of being caught in a fire in these conditions. The category of risk (per the BARR or Category 4 list) determines the actions that the school or early childhood service will need to take on days of elevated fire danger.

Our school will enact its pre-emptive action plan and also plan to close, in liaison with the Regional Director, on a day forecasted as Extreme Fire Danger Rating in our local government area (LGA), Cardinia Shire.

The department will advise our school of the potential for a **Catastrophic fire danger rating** as information becomes available, however the pre-emptive closure will be **confirmed by 1pm the day prior to Catastrophic fire danger day.** Fire danger ratings are forecast by the Bureau of Meteorology up to four days in advance. Should a Catastrophic day be forecast, we will notify you of the closure by an SMS, COMPASS and email. If we are unable to ascertain whether our message has been delivered, we will attempt to contact you by telephone. A hard copy letter will be provided if time allows. Please ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers.

Closure of the school due to a forecast Catastrophic day will be CONFIRMED ON THE DAY PRIOR and we will provide you with this advice before the end of the school day.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that:

- No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Catastrophic day.
- Out-of-school-hours care will also be cancelled on these days.
- School camps will be cancelled if a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast for the Bureau of Meteorology district in which the camp is located, or if the travel involves passing through areas that have Catastrophic fire danger.
- All bus routes that travel through the Catastrophic area will be cancelled.
- Depending on which fire weather district is impacted, bus route cancellations may affect our school.

As part of preparing our school for potential hazards such as fire, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan cleared our facility's grounds and gutters of debris.

School preparedness and pre-emptive actions for the bushfire season Page 2:

Families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan on Catastrophic fire danger rating days. On such days, children should never be left at home alone or in the care of older children.

The Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that when Catastrophic days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Catastrophic day. Please ensure your plan includes alternative care arrangements for your children in the event that our school is closed.

An SMS TEST MESSAGE will be sent Monday next week (Monday 5th February) to all registered parent mobile phone numbers from our Emergency Management SMS software.

The SMS system may be used in *Emergency or Urgent* situations to help keep the community informed. Messages would also be sent by Compass and email. This system assists with brief messages during power and internet outages. Test messages are sent prior to the bushfire season each year.

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$125 for primary school students
- · \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.
